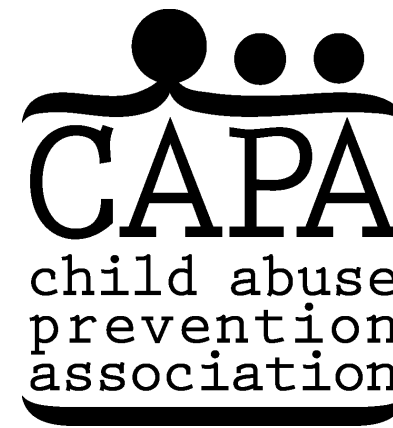

## Call to Action

What happened to Caylee Anthony may never be known nor anyone be brought to justice for the act that so sadly ended her life. As the highly publicized case indicated, child abuse victims rarely have successful outcomes through the criminal court systems. The burden of proof in criminal cases is extremely high. These cases, whether highly publicized like the Anthony case, or shrouded in confidentiality, are at best, extremely difficult to investigate and prosecute.

Our community is fortunate to have services in place that encourage collaboration such as the 14<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit's Multi-Disciplinary Treatment Team coordinated by Hope Haven of the Lowcountry, our local child advocacy center. Representatives from 30+ organizations, including CAPA, sit down together each month to discuss child abuse and neglect cases and make recommendations for working toward the best outcome for child victims. Sadly, this dedicated group

must review many cases each month. Child abuse and neglect happens in our community more often than we like to think. It is important that agencies support each other.

Children need caring and responsible adults in their lives who are willing to step forward and protect them from intentional and unintentional harm. The Child Abuse Prevention Association (CAPA) has been advocating for children and strengthening Beaufort County families for more than 30 years. You can get involved by volunteering, donating and speaking up.

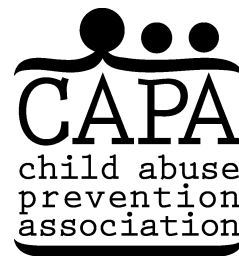

### A Guide to Internet Safety for Your Children

The Internet is a powerful tool. It allows children to explore endless possibilities. It can also expose them to inappropriate and dangerous material and open them to contact with unknown individuals. Sexual predators are increasingly using the Internet as a way to sexually exploit children. Children are curious individuals and are especially vulnerable to the deceptive tactics that predators use to target and lure them. Social networking websites such as facebook, Myspace and many others allow children to talk to one another, maintain relationships, post pictures, keep an online diary and meet new people. Often these websites require you to create a personal online profile including everything from name, favorite movies, likes and dislikes, school location, to the status of what you are currently doing. The danger of these personal online profiles is that children are giving out their personal information.

Michael J. Pierce, Special Agent U.S. Naval Criminal Investigative Service and CAPA Board Member has developed a compelling presentation on the dangers of the Internet for our children and warning signs and safety tips on what parents need to know to protect our youth. ### Cribs for Kids Program Partners with Local Agencies

We are excited to announce partnership with the Beaufort County Early Childhood Coalition to promote safe sleeping practices through CAPA's new Cribs for Kids program. The program's mission is to reduce the number of babies dying accidentally because of unsafe sleeping practices by educating parents and caregivers on the importance of safe sleep practices and providing cribs to families who cannot otherwise afford a safe place for their babies to sleep.

The safe sleep message centers around the **ABC's of Safe Sleep** - Your baby needs to sleep Alone, on his/her Back, and in a Crib or safe sleep environment. The following agencies and organizations have partnered with CAPA to promote safe sleeping practices throughout Beaufort County: First Steps, Family, Adult & Children's Educational Services (FACES), BJ EOC Head Start, Department of Health & Environmental Control (DHEC), Department of Social Services (DSS), New Parent Support Services (military families), PASOS (meaning Steps in Spanish), and Collaborative Organization of Services for Youths (COSY).

These partner agencies will assist CAPA in delivering the safe sleep message throughout Beaufort County. They will also refer clients to CAPA who would benefit from further education on safe sleeping and qualify to receive a portable crib.
