Fleetwood O'Farrell, Shelter Director, Retires Passing Torch to Tina Kuhn

Fleetwood O'Farrell, Director of CAPA's Open Arms Shelter for Abused and Neglected Children, officially retired as of July 1st. Fleetwood has been a dedicated employee for over nine years and has helped hundreds of local children transition through tough times. With a BA in Psychology and a Master's degree in Recreation and Parks Administration (Activity Therapy), she has worked for over 30 years in human services. In her nine years as the shelter director, Fleetwood was instrumental in the development and implementation of the CARE Curriculum, a Cornell University program specifically designed for emergency children's shelters. A native of South Carolina, Fleetwood encouraged a spirit of hospitality, treated everyone with respect and kept alive a sense of hope for a brighter tomorrow.

Upon Fleetwood's retirement on July 1, the shelter case manager, Tina Kuhn, took the reins as shelter director. Tina, with a BA in Interdis-

ciplinary Studies, has served as the shelter's case manager since 2008. She was the shelter's assistant case manager from 2004 to 2006, leaving to take the position of treatment coordinator for the Youth Advocate Program (YAP). Tina is also a graduate of the Model Leadership program with Columbia College. With a background in teaching and a great understanding of our area's resources, she brings a variety of skills and experience and will continue to move the shelter forward. Tina is patient and loving and always puts the needs of the children in the forefront. "I want to make a difference in each child's life during the short amount of time that we have them," stated Tina when asked about her role as shelter director.

The Open Arms Shelter is a Level One Group Home licensed by the Department of Social Services (DSS) and is staffed 24 hours a day, seven days a week. When a child is removed from his/her home and no

family member or foster home is available to take that child in, he or she will then be placed in the CAPA shelter. Since opening its doors in 1985, the shelter has served over 2,000 children. CAPA's Open Arms Shelter is the only shelter of its type serving the five county area – Beaufort, Jasper, Hampton, Colleton and Allendale.

The shelter is always looking for dedicated volunteers to spend quality time with the residents, including tutoring, arts and crafts, sports, and other activities. Please call CAPA at 843.524.4350 for more information.
